

Personal pronoun

A personal pronoun is used for the name of a person or thing.

Examples:

I, we, you, he, she, they, me, us, my, your

The persons of personal pronoun

According to conversation, the personal pronoun has three kinds:

- (1) First person I, we, us, me, our,
- (2) Second person you, your,
- (3) Third person he, she, it, they, him, her, his, them, their, its.





Reflexive pronoun:

When the action done by the subject reflects upon the subjects, it is called "reflexive pronoun".

Examples:

Myself, yourself, herself, himself, itself,

- 1. They enjoyed themselves.
- 2. I will do it myself.
- 3. You will hurt yourself.
- 4. She herself says so.
- 5. The village itself is not very small.





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


Indefinite pronoun:

These pronouns refer to people, place and things not in particular but in general way. Any, all, some, many, few, none, somebody, several, both are called indefinite pronoun.

Examples:

- 1. There is some milk in the jug.
- 2. Is anybody there?
- 3. Everybody is talking.
- 4. A few are going to abroad.
- 5. There are many flowers in the basket.





Relative pronouns

A relative pronoun is a word that works as a contact in a sentence.

Relative pronouns are "who, whose, whom, which,

Examples

- 1. He is the boy who kicked me.
- 2. This is the car which I want to buy.
- 3. This is the pen that I bought yesterday.
- 4. The moment which is lost forever.
