

Future Perfect Continuous tense

Positive sentences

In the formation of the 1st form of verb is added to ing. In the other words we say that fourth form of verb is used. 1st form of verb + ing is also known as fourth form of verb. (will have been , shall have been)" is helping verb.

Formation

Subject + (will have been, shall have been) + 1^{st} form of verb + ing + object+ since / for phrases

Examples

- We had been playing all day so we tired.
- You had been running all evening on the beach.
- Many peoples will have been participating in the sports for two years.

Future Perfect Continuous tense

Negative sentences

In the formation of the negative sentence of future perfect continuous tense we use not after (will, shall) and before have been.

Formation

Subject + (will, shall) + not + have been + 1st form of verb + object + ing + since / for phrases

Examples

- The child will not have been taking bath since morning.
- Boys will not have been dancing for three minutes.
- The woman will not have been noisy since morning.
- She will not have been playing with football for three hours.

Future Perfect Continuous tense

Interrogative sentences

In the formation of interrogative sentences helping verb. "will and shall" is placed at the start of sentence before subject and have been is placed after the subject at the last question mark is added.

Formation

Will/shall + Sub + have + been + ing form + object + since/for phrases.

Examples

- Will komal have been taking bath since evening?
- Will boys have been working for twenty hours?
- Will woman have been making noise since morning?
