



# Phrasal verbs **Bring**

## **Bring about:**

to cause

His lack of hard work brought about his failure.

## **Bring down:**

to humble down

His failure brought down his sense of honor.

## **Bring forward:**

put forth

He brought forward a strange proposal.

## **Bring in:**

to earn, to collect

Our shop brings in a large income.

## **Bring forth:**

to produce

This tree will bring forth fruit soon.

## **Bring on:**

to cause, to begin.

Dirt often brings on disease.



# Phrasal verbs **Bring**

## **Bring over:**

to persuade

I could not bring him over to my point of view.

## **Bring up:**

look after during childhood

I was brought up by my uncle in my childhood.

## **Bring under:**

to subdue

The mutiny was soon brought under control.

## **Bring round:**

To cause to recover

Several boys fainted in heat but the doctor soon brought them round.

## **Bring through:**

to cure an ailing

A careful nursing brought the ailing man through.

## **Bring off:**

to rescue
