



Present Continuous Tense

Positive sentences

In this simply first form of verb is used in the addition to (ing). Or we can say that the fourth form of verb is used. 1st form of verb + ing also known as fourth form of verb.

Formation

Subject+ helping verb (is/am/are) + 1st form of verb + ing+ object

Examples

- Boys are clapping and dancing.
- I am taking tea.
- Many of the students are participating in sports.
- He is cycling.
- She is crying.





Present Continuous Tense

Negative sentences

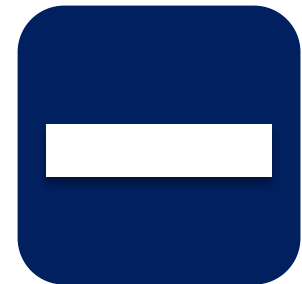
In the negative sentences, “Not” is added after the helping verb.

Formation

Subject + helping verb+ not + 1st form of verb + ing + object

Examples

- Harish is not running fast.
- He is not crying.
- Children are not turning on T.V.
- She is not cooking food.
- He is not offering prayer.
- Dog is not swimming in the water.





Present Continuous Tense

Interrogative sentences

In the interrogative sentences, helping verb “is, am, are” is placed at the start of sentences.

Formation

Helping verb + subject+ verb (1st form of verb) + ing+ object?

Examples

- Is it clouding?
- Is he crying?
- Is it raining?
- Is she arguing with parents?
- Am I walking on the bridge?
